FOR MOTORCYCLE ENTHUSIASTS & RIDERS**

1. The US Army, US Navy, and US Marine Corps all have a contract with Cape Fox to do motorcycle training. If there are seats available (not taken by their personnel) Coast Guard members are welcomed to take a spot as they are already being paid for by the respective Departments. These seats are at no charge for Coasties. If you are not sure about the course or want to verify information, the base's Ground Safety Officer or Traffic Safety Program Manager will have more information. Please use the respective Departments' Safety Websites to get the POC information.

The US Air Force also has training regularly at their bases, and if the training is being conducted in-house with their own Rider Coach, there is no charge for the training. If the training is contracted out, though, there is a charge per seat for non-Air Force personnel. Please be sure to ask first before signing up.
