Alaska

This section address the addition hazardous waste regulations, hazardous waste turn-in procedures, inspections and recordkeeping requirements for the State of Alaska.

1. The State of Alaska has adopted Universal waste regulation in accordance with 40 CFR 273.
2. All generators must notify the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) and obtain a state/USEPA identification number.
3. All generators must submit annual reports.

Hazardous Waste Turn-In

The following are the additional hazardous waste turn-in procedures required for proper turn-in and disposal of hazardous wastes from USCG units and facilities located within the State of Alaska.

1. All generators must provide two copies of hazardous waste transportation manifests to the ADEC and:
 - a. the first copy is signed by the generator, postmarked before shipment off-site, and mailed to the ADEC's central office.
 - b. the second copy is signed by the transporter and by the owner or operator of the designated facility that received the waste and is received by the ADEC's central office within 45 days after the date the waste was accepted by the initial transporter.

Inspections and Recordkeeping

The following section describes the recordkeeping and inspection requirements for managing hazardous materials and hazardous waste.
