### **ADMISSION ORDER**

On October 13, 2023, the United States Coast Guard Sector Charleston (Coast Guard) issued a Complaint against STERLEN RIHANE GRANT (Respondent) seeking to suspend his Merchant Mariner Credential (MMC or credential) for committing misconduct under 46 U.S.C. § 7703(1)(B) and 46 C.F.R. § 5.27.

Specifically, the Coast Guard alleges on July 17, 2023, Respondent took a required preemployment drug test pursuant to 46 C.F.R. Part 16, in which Respondent's specimen was determined to be a substitute specimen. Therefore, Respondent refused to take a required 46 C.F.R. Part 16 drug test, as stated in 49 C.F.R. § 40.191(b). Refusal to take a required drug test is misconduct as described by 46 U.S.C. § 7703(1)(B) and defined by 46 C.F.R. § 5.27. In aggravation, the Coast Guard also alleges, substitution is an intentional act and interferes with the integrity of the testing process, which creates a risk of an impaired mariner continuing to serve in a safety sensitive position.

In Respondent's Answer, dated October 13, 2023, he admits to all jurisdictional and factual allegations, and agrees with the proposed sanction.

WHEREFORE,

### **ORDER**

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that Respondent's violation of misconduct under 46 U.S.C. § 7703(1)(B) and 46 C.F.R. § 5.27 is **PROVED BY ANSWER**. I have carefully reviewed the file and find that the proposed sanction is appropriate under the provisions of 46 C.F.R. § 5.569.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent's Merchant Mariner Credential is

SUSPENDED OUTRIGHT FOR TWENTY-FOUR (24) MONTHS, commencing the date it
is deposited with the Coast Guard.
