¹ The parties initially submitted their Motion for Approval of Settlement Agreement and Entry of a Consent Order on March 26, 2024. On May 30, 2024, I conducted a pre-hearing conference to address the Coast Guard's proposed sanction of revocation for the allegation of misconduct without including aggravating factors in its Complaint and rejected the Settlement Agreement. The Coast Guard filed an Amended Complaint on June 6, 2024, to include matters of aggravation to support the proposed sanction of revocation. On July 1, 2024, the Coast Guard resubmitted the parties' Motion for Approval of Settlement Agreement and Entry of a Consent Order, which is before me, and I approve.
