ADMISSION ORDER

On April 12, 2024, the United States Coast Guard Sector Maryland-National Capital Region issued a Complaint against Respondent, Phillip Scott Marsh, alleging they violated 46 U.S.C. § 7703(1)(B). The Coast Guard proposes a sanction of 3 months outright suspension of Respondent's Merchant Mariner Credential (MMC).

The ALJ Docketing Center received Respondent's Answer, dated April 29, 2024, admitting all jurisdictional and factual allegations and agreeing to the proposed sanction.

WHEREFORE,

Based on consideration of the record, I hereby **ORDER** that the allegations in the Complaint are **PROVED BY ANSWER**. I have carefully reviewed the Complaint and Answer and find that the proposed sanction is appropriate under the provisions of 46 C.F.R. § 5.569.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Respondent's Coast Guard issued Merchant Mariner Credentials are Suspended Outright for three (3) Months, commencing on the date Respondent's credentials are deposited with the USCG Sector Maryland – National Capital Region. Respondent shall immediately deposit, by mail or in person, his Merchant Mariner Credential and any other Coast Guard issued credentials to: USCG Sector Maryland, 2401 Hawkins Point Rd., Baltimore, MD 21226. Further, Respondent shall immediately cease using all Coast Guard issued credentials, including his Merchant Mariner Credential.
