CONSENT ORDER APPROVING SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND MEMORIALIZING CLARIFICATIONS TO SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

On April 3, 2024, the Coast Guard submitted a Motion for Approval of Settlement Agreement and Entry of Consent Order (Motion), to be approved as a settlement of the case under 33 C.F.R. § 20.502. On April 9, 2024, I held a telephonic conference to discuss terms of the Settlement Agreement that appeared ambiguous and to request the clarification of the parties.

Pursuant to the agreement of the parties during the conference, the following clarifications represent the intentions of the parties at the time of signing of the Settlement Agreement, and the parties desire that the language of Settlement Agreement reflect these changes:

1) At Section 3.a., the following sentence should be added to the end of the paragraph: "The period of outright suspension mentioned in Section 2 shall begin on the date of deposit of the MMC."

2) Section 3.d. should state, "Not later than ninety (90) days from the date Respondent signs this Settlement Agreement, Respondent understands and agrees to attend an agreed upon sexual harassment, sexual assault prevention course specific to the

maritime industry."

I find the terms of the Settlement Agreement, as clarified by the points above, are fair and

reasonable and in substantial compliance with the requirements of 33 C.F.R. § 20.502.

WHEREFORE,

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the Motion for Approval of Settlement Agreement and

Entry of Consent Order is **GRANTED**, and the Settlement Agreement, as clarified above, is

APPROVED in full and incorporated herein by reference. This Consent Order shall constitute

full, final, and complete adjudication of this proceeding.
