Judge Stueve (STEE-vee) serves as a Coast Guard Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) in Alameda, California. The Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security appointed Judge Stueve to this position in 2020. He hears and decides Merchant Mariner Credential suspension and revocation cases, as well as other cases initiated by the Department of Homeland Security and other federal agencies as assigned by the U.S. Office of Personnel Management.

Prior to serving as an ALJ for the U.S. Coast Guard, Judge Stueve served as an Social Security Administration (SSA) ALJ for twelve years. His positions included service as Hearing Office Chief ALJ and as the SSA National Cadre Lead for ALJ training.

Judge Stueve's judicial career began in 2004 with his appointment as a Courts-martial Military Judge for the U.S. Coast Guard.

Judge Stueve's previous experience as an attorney with the U.S. Coast Guard includes service in a variety of positions including: Assistant Legal Officer at the Thirteenth Coast Guard District; Defense Counsel at Navy Legal Service Command-Northwest; Assistant Professor of Law, Principal Assistant Legal Officer, and Special Assistant U.S. Attorney at the U.S. Coast Guard Academy; and Principal Assistant Legal Officer at Maintenance & Logistics Command Pacific, Eleventh Coast Guard District, and Pacific Area.

Prior to attending law school, Judge Stueve served tours in the Coast Guard as a Deck Watch Officer, Commanding Officer of two patrol boats, Marine Inspector, and an Investigating Officer. In his final tour on active duty, he served as Executive Officer of U.S. Coast Guard Training Center Petaluma.

Judge Stueve is a 1988 graduate of the United States Coast Guard Academy, with high honors, and a 1997 graduate of the Washington University School of Law, where he was elected to the Order of the Coif.
