ADMISSION ORDER

On or about May 22, 2025, the United States Coast Guard (USCG or Coast Guard), submitted a Complaint against Dylan Wright (Respondent) alleging Respondent committed misconduct while acting under the authority of Respondent's Merchant Mariner Credential (MMC) as an Able Seaman aboard the vessel SHENANDOAH TRADER, as required by law or regulation.

The Coast Guard alleges:

1. On December 23, 2024, Respondent was employed by US Marine Management LLC and subject to US Marine Management LLC's drug and alcohol policies.
2. On December 23, 2024, US Marine Management LLC had a policy prohibiting employees from having the presence of 0.04% blood alcohol level (BAC) or above in the body, while assigned to a vessel.
3. On December 23, 2024, at approximately 0015, Respondent had a BAC greater than 0.04% while assigned to a US Marine Management vessel, in violation of US Marine Management LLC Drug and Alcohol's section on Alcohol Prohibited Conduct.
4. Respondent's violation of US Marine Management LLC's Drug and Alcohol policy is Misconduct, as described by 46 U.S.C. § 7703(1)(B) and defined by 46 C.F.R. § 5.27.

In Respondent's Answer, dated May 29, 2025, Respondent admits to all jurisdictional and factual allegations, as stated in the Complaint. Respondent also agreed to the proposed order of three (3) months outright suspension, with no additional conditions stipulated.

Upon consideration of the record, I hereby find that the allegations in the Complaint are **PROVED BY ANSWER**. I find that on December 23, 2024, Respondent's violation of US Marine Management LLC Drug and Alcohol policy is Misconduct, as described by 46 U.S.C. § 7703(1)(B) and defined by 46 C.F.R. § 5.27.

SANCTION

I have carefully reviewed the Complaint and Answer and find that the proposed sanction is appropriate under the provisions of 46 C.F.R. § 5.569.

WHEREFORE,

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, Respondent's Coast Guard issued MMC is **SUSPENDED OUTRIGHT FOR THREE (3) MONTHS**, commencing the date it was deposited with the Coast Guard.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE, service of this decision on the parties and/or parties' representative(s) serves as notice of appeal rights set forth in 33 C.F.R. §§ 20.1001 – 20.1004. (Attachment A).
