Chief McMullen currently serves as the Administrative Branch Chief and Senior Enlisted Leader (SEL) for the Office of the Chief Prosecutor in Charleston, South Carolina. In this role, she provides crucial administrative and trial logistics support to a team of legal professionals. As Silver Badge, Chief McMullen serves as the principal advisor to the Chief Prosecutor on all matters affecting the enlisted workforce, representing the concerns, morale, and welfare of the enlisted personnel to the command.

Chief McMullen began her military career after graduating from Louisiana State University in 2013, where she earned dual degrees in Psychology (B.S.) and Sociology (B.A.). In her first assignment, she served operationally as a Spanish translator onboard the USCGC ALERT (September 2013 to October

2014). Following Yeoman "A" School, Chief McMullen provided personnel support at Sector Southeastern New England (January 2015 to April 2016), served as Approving Official at Base Cape Cod Servicing Personnel Office (April 2016 to June 2018), and tackled independent duty at Activities Far East in Fussa, Japan (June 2018 to July 2022). Chief McMullen was then selected for the Coast Guard's Paralegal Advanced Education Program, through which she obtained a B.A. in Legal Studies from Tulane University in 2024. Chief McMullen then went on to earn her Master of Business Administration in June 2025.

Individual military awards include the Coast Guard Commendation Medal with the Operational Distinguishing Device, the Coast Guard Letter of Commendation (3) with the Operational Distinguishing Device, the Coast Guard Overseas Service Ribbon, and the Coast Guard Sea Service Ribbon.
