COAST GUARD HISTORY



On January 28, 1980, the Coast Guard Cutter BLACKTHORN collided with a tanker near Tampa Bay, Florida. As the BLACKTHORN began to capsize, Seaman Apprentice William R. Flores threw lifejackets to his shipmates in the water and used his trouser belt to hold the lifejacket locker door open allowing more to float to the surface. After most of the crew had abandoned ship, nineteen-year-old Flores chose to remain on board the sinking ship to assist trapped crew members and sacrificed his own life. Flores posthumously received the CG Medal for unselfish acts of heroism. Source: USCG History Website

Earlier Admiral Allen and Master Chief Petty Officer of the Coast Guard (MCPOCG) Skip Bowen visited North Carolina Agricultural and Technical (A&T) State University in Greensboro. LCDR Adrian West and LCDR Dwayne Meekins (both NC A&T Alumni) coordinated a full day of activities which included interviews with campus television and discussions with university leadership on the Coast Guard's College Student Pre-Commissioning Initiative (CSPI), Graduate Programs, civilian employment, and internships.

While on campus, ADM Allen conducted a 'Leadership Lecture' for Ph.D. candidates in the Leadership Studies Program. He shared his unique perspective and personal account of leadership in times of great duress, using response to Hurricane Katrina as an example. Participants said that his views on leading people added seamless context to leadership theories covered in the Ph.D. program.
