CDR James C. Campbell has served as the Deputy Sector Commander for U.S. Coast Guard Sector Guam, since June 2015. CDR Campbell serves as the principal deputy and advisor to the Sector Commander and as his alternate in performing a wide-range of federal authorizations including Captain of the Port, Federal Maritime Security Coordinator, Federal On-Scene Coordinator, Officer-in-Charge of Maritime Inspections, and Search & Rescue Mission Coordinator with an area of responsibility of 1.9 million square nautical miles that encompasses Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Republic of Palau and the Federated States of Micronesia.

Prior to this assignment, Commander Campbell was stationed at Maritime Safety and Security Team San Diego where he served as both the Operations Officer during his first year and Logistics Officer his second year.



CDR Campbell's initial enlistment was in the U.S. Army where he graduated from the United States Army Infantry School at Sand Hill in Fort Benning, GA. He has served a total of nine years as an enlisted member to include six years in the U.S. Army and three years in the U.S. Coast Guard. Other enlisted duties include: U.S. Army Infantry Squad Leader, U.S. Army Counterintelligence Agent, and recruit Company Commander at USCG Training Center Cape May, NJ.

He graduated from Officer Candidate School in 2000 and has served in a variety of operational and staff assignments spanning five Districts/Groups/Sectors. Majority of his operational tours were served in the Deployable Specialized Forces community in providing oversight for joint and independent INCONUS/OCONUS deployments for Short Notice Maritime Response (SNMR), high-risk CG law enforcement, maritime counter-terrorism, Advanced Interdiction (AI), and Nat'l Special Security Events (NSSE).

While serving as the Team Leader for Field Intelligence Support Team New Orleans in 2005, Hurricane Katrina struck where he served as the Planning Section and developed and implemented the response plans to stand up a forward operations base at Zephyr Field for the Urban Search and Rescue teams to the devastated city of New Orleans.

Other tours include Honor Guardsman, U.S. Coast Guard Ceremonial Honor Guard in Washington DC; Assistant Surface Operations Officer, Group Corpus Christi; Operations Officer, MSST Miami; Conference Coordinator, Coast Guard's Senior Executive Leadership Conference; and Coast Guard Liaison Officer, U.S. Embassy Haiti.

CDR Campbell's military decorations include five Coast Guard Commendation Medals, two Army Commendation Medals, two Coast Guard Achievement Medals, Army Achievement Medal, Commandant's Letter of Commendation, and other personal and unit awards. CDR Campbell also completed his MBA at Florida International University in Miami, FL.
