UNIT MISSIONS: Station Fairport performs Search and Rescue, Maritime Law Enforcement, Ice Rescue, and Enforcement of Laws and Treaties.

TYPICAL SA/SN JOB ASSIGNMENT: An SA/SN shall certify Communications Watch-stander, Boat Crewmember, Boarding Team Member, and Ice Rescuer.

TYPICAL FA/FN JOB ASSIGNMENT: An FA/FN shall certify Communications Watch-stander, Boat Crewmember, RBM Engineer, Boarding Team Member, and Ice Rescuer

INPORT WATCH TYPE AND DUTY ROTATION FOR SA/SN: Station Duty Port and Starboard with sliding weekends. Port and Starboard is where there are two duty sections which alternate duty days. Ex: Stand duty Monday and Tuesday; off work Wednesday

and Thursday; back on duty Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Then off Monday and Tuesday; back on Wednesday and Thursday; and off for the weekend. Station duty consists of Communications Watch, performing underway missions as required, as well as maintenance of the boats and station facilities.

**INPORT WATCH TYPE AND DUTY ROTATION FOR FA/FN:** Station Duty Port and Starboard with sliding weekends. Port and Starboard is where there are two duty sections which alternate duty days. Ex: Stand duty Monday and Tuesday; off work Wednesday and Thursday; back on duty Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Then off Monday and Tuesday; back on Wednesday and Thursday; and off for the weekend. Station duty consists of Communications Watch, performing underway missions as required, as well as maintenance of the boats and station facilities.

**HOW MUCH PERSONAL STORAGE SPACE:** All personnel will have use of a locker that is approximately 7 ft. high, 4 ft. wide, and 2 ft. deep located in the berthing rooms. Additionally, each member will be able to utilize a duty locker of similar dimensions for all boat crew gear located in the unit's locker rooms.

**LOCATION OF NEAREST EXCHANGE AND COMMISARY:** There is a small exchange located within the same federal building as the 9<sup>th</sup> Coast Guard District HQ. There is also a small package store located on board Base Cleveland at 1055 E. 9<sup>th</sup> St. in

Cleveland. There is also an off base exchange located at 13920 W. Parkway Rd in Cleveland.

**AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY (AOR):** The portion of Lake Erie between Geneva state park to the East and Moss Point to the West, extending North to the International Border. Approximately 800 square nautical miles. In addition to the above area, STA Fairport assists STA Ashtabula to the East by covering their AOR beyond 10nm off-shore.

**UNIFORM TO REPORT IN:** Members are to report aboard in Tropical Blue Long (April-October), and Service Dress Blue uniform (November-March).

**IF SPONSOR NOT AVAILABLE, MEMBER SHOULD ASK FOR:** Station Officer of the Day.

**ANY OTHER INFORMATION A NEWLY ARRIVING MEMBER NEEDS TO KNOW:** Newly reporting members shall report at 0800 on the date stated on their Original Travel Orders. If the members scheduled report date is on a Friday, Saturday, Sunday, or a Federal Holiday, they must contact the Executive Petty Officer prior to reporting aboard so reporting arrangements can be made.

#### MEMBERS WITHOUT DEPENDENTS

**IS MESSING AVAILABLE:** Yes, the unit has a galley and a FS to provide meals.

**QUARTERS AND OR BARRACKS AVAILABLE:** There is no housing available on base. Members are required to maintain a residence off base. There are numerous apartment complexes in the area as well as houses for sale and/or rent.

**WHERE WILL A SINGLE NON-RATE MORE THAN LIKELY LIVE:** There is no on base housing and members will be required to live on the economy in the local area. Members receive Basic Allowance for Housing to assist with the cost of living off base.

**SHOULD MEMBER SUBMIT HOUSING APPLICATION TO HOUSING OFFICE:** Yes, members must submit CG Form 5267. Since no housing is available the local housing manager will release the member to housing on the economy.

**WHERE DO MOST PEOPLE BANK:** There are a number of banks in the area. Some members keep an account with USAA, which can also provide auto and renters/homeowners insurance.

IS THERE A CREDIT UNION IN THE AREA: Yes, Navy Federal located in Cleveland, OH.

IS THERE A MALL IN THE AREA: Yes, located in Mentor approximately 5 miles from the unit.
