Subject: Hyperlite Chamber Training

All - I will conduct training on the use of our Hyperlite portable chamber on Friday, 10Jun at 1500, in the hangar. Why am I asking you to attend?

Divers - It'll save your life & help you save the life of a buddy.

Medical - You will obviously be involved in a dive-related casualty, especially for the administering of O2 and monitoring of vital signs.

Aviators - If a diving casualty occurs when we are close enough to land to fly the helo in, we will need to ensure the aviators know exactly how to fit the chamber into the helo & "how" to fly with a diver under pressure.

ALCON - When divers are away from the ship, we will need personnel onboard to set-up the chamber during our transit back if we have an ill diver.

I expect the training to last nearly 2 hours. We will be learning how to set-up the chamber & the basic theory of use of pressure treatments, and will place a diver in the chamber for realistic hands-on trng in carrying & securing the chamber in the helo. We will be conducting a high number of dives in July under ice and for long periods of time. Cold water & long dives raises the risk of dive illness. We all need to be aware of & prepared for an unfortunate event.

Please let me know if anyone has any major conflicts or questions.

LT [REDACTED] - I will let you determine who should be involved in this training, but would suggest all the pilots (minus Kodiak who aren't staying with us) and at least a few of the mechs.
