## Cutter History:

The second cutter *Gallatin* was probably built in Baltimore, Maryland and was stationed in Charleston, South Carolina. There is no record of her beyond 1824. *Gallatin* and the cutter *South Carolina* (built in Baltimore and entered service in 1815-1816) may have been the same vessel.
