Accessing the IBRD

- The IBRD is designed for countries that do not have their own beacon registration database or a means for RCCs to access it 24/7
- All US RCCs use the same account to access the IBRD: www.406registration.com



Resolving IBRD Account Lock-Out (1 of 2)

- When one US RCC Controller is locked out of the IBRD, all US RCC Controllers are locked out
- When a lock-out occurs, the following steps are taken:
 - The RCC Controller calls the USMCC Controller (301-817-4576) to report the lock-out
 - The USMCC Controller verifies the RCC caller
 - The USMCC Controller notifies all RCCs of the lock-out and informs them to request IBRD information via the USMCC



Resolving IBRD Account Lock-Out (2 of 2)

- The USMCC Controller queries the IBRD on behalf of RCCs, as needed
- The USMCC Controller contacts the COSPAS-SARSAT Secretariat during normal working hours and asks that the US RCC IBRD account be unlocked
- The USMCC Controller notifies all RCCs when the account is unlocked

Resolving IBRD Account Forgotten Passwords



- When the RCC Controller forgets the IBRD account password but the IBRD is not locked:
 - The RCC Controller calls the USMCC Controller to request the password
 - The USMCC Controller verifies the caller (calls the appropriate RCC and asks for the caller by name)
 - The USMCC Controller provides the password information to the RCC Controller
