<p>1. Prepare for fishing voyage</p> <p>A. What factors should be taken into account when deciding composition of the watch.</p> <p>B. Make a plan</p> <p>C. Schedule a watch rotation -Not to interfere with fatigue</p> <p>D. Safety briefing - Anyone onboard not able to safely perform a watch - No duties to interfere with a safe watch</p> <p>2. Watches</p> <p>A. When assigned to a watch, you are responsible for proper performance of all duties. -Remain alert -Be prepared for an emergency -Avoid collisions and stranding -Must know the location and operation of navigational and safety equipment</p> <p>B. You may decline to relieve the watch only if you feel it is justified.</p> <p>C. Do not leave the wheelhouse until relieved or secured by proper authority.</p> <p>D. Report to watch 15 minutes early. -You can receive information and instructions from person on watch -For night lookout, it gives you time to adjust to night vision -The person in charge can educate the new watch keeper to insure the course steered, position and speed are correct and the vessel follow the planned course</p> <p>E.
